

ABOUT OUR LOW COST SPAY/ NEUTER PROGRAM . . .

Why should you spay or neuter your pet? The sad reality is that over three million cats and dogs are euthanized in animal shelters every **year**, simply because there aren't enough homes for them. Even when people are able to find caring owners for all their pet's kittens or puppies, that means fewer homes for shelter pets. All too often, they just end up at the shelter too — or worse, are abandoned to fend for themselves. By spaying or neutering your pet, you can help fight the problem of pet overpopulation.

There are other benefits as well. Neutered male cats or dogs are less likely to wander off looking for a mate, and so have less risk of being run over, being injured in fights, or getting lost. They're also less likely to spray/mark their territory (along with mounting and aggressiveness for dogs) especially if they're neutered before they start doing so. Spayed females don't go into heat, with all that entails, and won't surprise you with litters that you'll need to find homes for. There are also additional health benefits for males and females of both species. (Rabbits too!)

What you can do (and how we can help):

A number of local veterinarians participate in our low-cost spay/neutering program. By taking your pet to one of the veterinarians listed, some or even all of the full cost of the procedure will be covered by the spay/neuter certificate. The veterinarian will be reimbursed by the Refuge at a higher rate once the signed certificate is received. Simply present the certificate to the participating veterinarian at the time of surgery and she/he will sign and mail it to the Refuge.

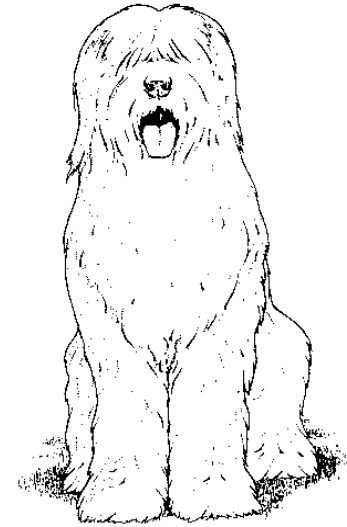
ABOUT YOUR SPAY/NEUTER CERTIFICATE . . .

Don't lose it! Only one certificate will be issued per animal. No duplicates will be issued and no copies will be accepted. Treat your certificate as if it were cash — it can't be replaced!

- The spay/neuter certificate will cover some or all of the cost of anesthesia, the surgery itself, routine hospitalization (overnight) and suture removal, if necessary. The certificate (with a few exceptions) does *not* cover vaccinations, a physical exam, or any special surgical procedure. **Make sure to talk to the veterinarian to find out how much of the cost is covered, what's included, and if there will be any additional fees.**
- The veterinarian may refuse to perform surgery if the pet is in poor health, has not had a veterinary examination, or is not up to date on vaccinations. The veterinarian may also refuse to perform surgery if an appointment for the operation has not been arranged. **Please make sure to contact the vet for an appointment!**
- The veterinarians listed here have volunteered to participate in the Morris Animal Refuge's low-cost spay/neuter program. The Refuge is thankful for their participation, but it can't assume responsibility for such services, and inclusion in this listing does not constitute an endorsement by the Refuge.
